	<ol> <li>Attempted Burglary – This took place in Locksley Park at a house which is currently under renovation. Substantial damage was caused to the patio doors but no entry was gained.</li> <li>ASB – This occurred in Locksley Gardens and involved a drunk male knocking on resident's doors.</li> <li>Burglary – This occurred in Benmore Drive. Entry was gained via the conservatory. Doors were forced using resident's own spade from shed. Handbags and cash were stolen.</li> <li>Suspicious – This occurred in Ramore Park. A silver van with an English reg plate was parked outside a house with 3 males in the van. Possible travellers.
